## NORTH SMITHFIELD HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® RHODE ISLAND SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 5, 2014) — In its 29<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Karissa Carlton of North Smithfield High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Rhode Island Softball Player of the Year. The 5-foot-4 senior right-handed pitcher posted a 16-1 record along with a 0.72 ERA in the circle this past season, leading the Lady Northmen (16-1) to the Division II state tournament. Carlton struck out 170 batters and walked just 17 in 97 innings pitched. A 2013 Rhode Island Coaches Association First Team All-State selection, she allowed just 46 hits, firing two no-hitters, including a perfect game.

Carlton has maintained a B average in the classroom. A competitive equestrian rider, she has volunteered locally using horsemanship to provide therapeutic services to children and adults with developmental disorders.

"Karissa Carlton is hands down the best pitcher I have seen since the pitching rubber was moved back to the college distance of 43 feet," said Bill Aquilante, head coach of Pilgrim High. "She has complete command of the strike zone and makes you chase her pitch once she gets ahead."

Carlton will attend the University of Rhode Island this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
