CHICAGO (June 5, 2014) — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Cayla Drotar of Hartsville High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade South Carolina Softball Player of the Year. Drotar is the first Gatorade South Carolina Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from Hartsville High School.

The 5-foot-7 sophomore right-handed pitcher led the Red Foxes (26-3) to the Class 3A state championship game this past season. Drotar owned a 14-2 record and a 1.18 ERA in the circle, along with a .560 batting average, 12 home runs and 44 RBI at the plate. The two-time Class 3A Player of the Year, she struck out 138 batters in 95 innings pitched.

Drotar has maintained a 3.37 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally assisting the homeless and has participated in the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life.

"She's a power hitter and a great pitcher," said Adam Jones, head coach at St. James High. "She throws the ball as hard as anybody you'll see on TV, and she gets better as the game goes on. She's as tough as anybody as a hitter too. If you leave a ball over the plate, she'll put it over the fence."

Drotar will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
