FAIRVIEW HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 19, 2014) — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Baylor Reese of Fairview High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Oklahoma Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. The 5-foot-9 junior hurled the discus a meet-record 140 feet, 7 inches to win her third consecutive Class 2A state championship this spring. Reese also won the discus at the state's Meet of Champions with a throw of 132-10, and her season-best effort of 149-5 ranked as the nation's No. 34 performance among prep competitors in 2014 at the time of her selection.

Reese has maintained a perfect 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A devoted parishioner in her church community and a member of her school's student council, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life, food-donation drives and a community recycling program.

"Baylor Reese is the hardest worker I've ever had in 15 years of coaching track," said Fairview coach Brock Robison.
"She's positive and upbeat, just a tremendous leader and role model for younger athletes."

Reese will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
