**KODIAK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED  
GATORADE ALASKA BOYS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (June 20, 2014) — In its 29<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Levi Thomet of Kodiak High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Alaska Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Thomet is the third Gatorade Alaska Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Kodiak High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Thomet as Alaska's best high school boys track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Thomet joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Meb Keflezighi (1993-94, San Diego HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.) and Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt HS, Ia.).

The 5-foot-7, 128-pound junior won three individual state championships at the Class 4A state meet this season, leading the Bears to third place as a team. The state's returning Gatorade Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year, Thomet broke the tape in the 800-meter run with a time of 2:01.09, the 1,600 in 4:23.16 and the 3,200 in 9:31.60. He also anchored the 4x800-meter relay that won in 8:10.55. Also the two-time Gatorade Alaska Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year, his seventh-place 5,000 time of 14:40.44 at the New Balance Nationals Outdoor championships ranked as the nation's No. 8 performance among prep competitors at the time of his selection.

Thomet has maintained a 3.71 GPA in the classroom. A talented musician, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth hockey and running programs.

"He is without question the best in the state and has national rankings in the distance events," said Bill Steyer, head coach of rival Homer High. "Additionally, he is an excellent role model in the areas of leadership, sportsmanship and work ethic."

Thomet will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with [USA TODAY High School Sports](#), which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Thomet joins Gatorade Alaska Boys Track & Field Athletes of the Tyler Rohde (2011-12, Chugiak High School), Elliott Bauer (2010 - 11, South Anchorage High School), Silas Talbot (2009-10, Service), Trevor Dunbar (2008-09, Kodiak), Jordan Clarke (2007-08 & 2006-07, Bartlett) among the state's list of former award winners.
