MOUNT MANSFIELD UNION HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE VERMONT BOYS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 20, 2014) — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Alec Eschholz of Mount Mansfield Union High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Vermont Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Eschholz is the second Gatorade Vermont Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Mount Mansfield Union High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Eschholz as Vermont's best high school boys track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Eschholz joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Meb Keflezighi (1993-94, San Diego HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.) and Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt HS, Ia.).

The returning Gatorade State Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year, the 5-foot-11, 145-pound junior won four individual state championships at the Division I state meet this spring and led the Cougars to a second-place finish as a team. Eschholz set a state record in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 14.31 seconds. He also took gold in the 300-meter hurdles in a meet-record time of 38.36, as well as the high jump and the long jump. Also the state record-holder in the 300 hurdles and the 400-meter hurdles, his clocking of 54.14 seconds in the 400 hurdles ranked as the nation's No. 28 performance among prep competitors in 2014 at the time of his selection.

Eschholz has maintained a 3.86 GPA in the classroom. A member of Mount Mansfield High's Athletic Leadership Council, he has volunteered as part of area beautification projects, as a youth track coach and as a youth soccer referee.

"This year, Alec Eschholz has no peer," said Chip Langmaid, head coach of St. Johnsbury Academy. "He is winning a wide range of events and breaking records in his specialty, the hurdles. He clearly leads his team, albeit quietly, and they rallied around him to nearly win the state title."

Eschholz will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Eschholz joins Gatorade Vermont Boys Track & Field Athletes of the Year Jacob Ellis (2011-12, Brattleboro Union High School), Mike DiMambro (2010 – 11 & 2009-10, Essex High School), Adron Pitmon (2008-09, Mt. Mansfield Union), Ken Bunnell (2007-08, St. Johnsbury Academy), and David Kennedy (2006-2007, Lamoille Union) among the state's list of former award winners.
