C.M. RUSSELL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MONTANA FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Russell High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Montana Football Player of the Year. Grinde is the third Gatorade Montana Football Player of the Year to be chosen from C.M. Russell High School.

The 5-foot-11, 215-pound junior running back rushed for 2,180 yards and 20 touchdowns on 328 carries this past season, leading the Rustlers to a 10-3 record and the Class AA state championship game. Grinde also caught 31 passes for 489 yards and three touchdowns. He was a First Team All-Conference and Second Team All-State selection as a sophomore.

Grinde has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. Vice president of his graduating class, he has served as an elementary school tutor in addition to volunteering locally on behalf of the Special Olympics, the United Way and a youth soccer team.

"Grinde is the best back I've seen in a long time," said Paul Klaboe, head coach at Billings West High. "He's strong and fast and hard to bring down. All 11 guys know he's getting the ball and still can't bring him down."

Grinde will begin his senior year of high school next fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
