## MARYSVILLE-PILCHUCK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® WASHINGTON FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11, 185-pound senior running back rushed for 1,768 yards and 32 touchdowns on 133 carries this past season, leading the Tomahawks (11-2) to the Class 3A semifinals. A three-time First Team All-State selection, Joyner averaged 13.3 yards per carry and needed only 4.2 touches for every touchdown he scored this season.

Joyner has maintained a 3.16 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, he has volunteered locally as a youth football camp counselor.

"Austin Joyner is a great competitor," said Dave Telford, head coach at Stanwood High. "It's hard to root against him, even though as an opponent you don't want him to have success. He displays great sportsmanship both on and off the field. He plays full speed on every play. Off the field, he is a polite, humble person."

Joyner has verbally committed to play football on scholarship at Washington State University beginning in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
