SOUTH ANCHORAGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Sims has maintained a 3.50 GPA in the classroom. She has served as an elected member of her student government and has volunteered locally on behalf of her church youth group, as a mentor for students with special needs and as a volleyball camp counselor.

"Kayla Sims is one of those special athletes that a coach can count on to go above and beyond in her preparation and work ethic," said Kim Lauwers, head coach at Dimond High. "I don't think she would know what to do with any extra time in her day but I believe she would use it to advance her sports skills or athletic ability."

Sims remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
