OVIEDO HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® FLORIDA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (December 11, 2014) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Courtney Furlong of Oviedo High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Florida Volleyball Player of the Year. Furlong is the first Gatorade Florida Volleyball Player of the Year to be chosen from Oviedo High School.

The two-time Class 7A Player of the Year as named by the Florida Dairy Farmers, Furlong collected 592 service receptions, 361 digs, 37 blocks and 32 service aces. She also led Orlando Volleyball Academy to an 11th-place finish in the 18 Open division of the 2014 USA Volleyball Girls' Junior National Championships.

Furlong has maintained a 4.16 weighted GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society, she has also donated her time as a youth volleyball instructor.

"Courtney Furlong is one of the best athletes to ever come out of Oviedo High School," said Lions head coach Jen Darty.
"What she has brought to our program and the legacy that she is leaving behind is like no other. On the volleyball court, Courtney's presence is felt by all."

Furlong has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of South Carolina in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Plant), Jessica Yingling (2008-09, Timber Creek) and Kellie Catanach (2007-08, HB Plant) among the state's list of former award winners.
