## MERCY ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® KENTUCKY VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Jewell has maintained a 3.94 GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society and the Future Business Leaders of America, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth volleyball teams and the Lifehouse Maternity Home, a community resource for women facing unexpected pregnancies.

"It's not just Jewell's skills and talent," said Caitlin Welch, head coach at duPont Manual High. "She's got a great drive and will to win, and her volleyball IQ is off the charts. She has a great ability to see what's happening on the court on both sides of the net."

Jewell has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at Morehead State University in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
