## OCEAN SPRINGS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSISSIPPI VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Mohler has maintained a 3.77 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, she has served on the student council and has volunteered locally as a peer mentor.

"Mohler is 6-foot-2, she's strong at the net and she has a monster jump serve," said Allison Burchyett, head coach at Southaven High. "Once she gets going, she's hard to stop."

Mohler has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at Purdue University in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
