NORMAN NORTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® OKLAHOMA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A 2014 First Team All-State selection, Alford is also a 2014-15 American Volleyball Coaches Association Second Team Under Armour All-America honoree.

Alford has maintained a 3.82 GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and as a youth volleyball coach and camp counselor.

"Audrey Alford is an extremely well-trained setter and is very consistent," said Norman North head coach Stephanie Kane. "She never had a bad game and her sets were always on point. Her leadership never failed our young team and they rallied behind her and played great volleyball all season."

Alford has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Oklahoma in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
