BAYLOR SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® TENNESSEE VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Gray has maintained a 3.94 GPA in the classroom. Also a talented artist, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth volleyball programs.

"Gray is young, but she's absolutely the real deal," said Paul Brock, head coach at Girls Preparatory School. "It's hard to stop her at the net, but she can also pass and play all the way around."

Gray will begin her junior year of high school next fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
