## BOISE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE IDAHO GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 8, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Emily Hamlin of Boise High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Idaho Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. The 5-foot-4 senior raced to a Class 5A individual state championship this past season with a time of 18:14.7, leading the Braves to a third-place finish as a team. The 2013-14 Gatorade Idaho Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year, Hamlin earned seventh place at the Nike Cross Northwest Regional championships, crossing the line in 19:25. She went on to compete at the NXN Final, where she finished 75th in 18:56.

Hamlin has maintained a 3.87 GPA in the classroom. A member of her school's Humanitarian Club, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Boise Rescue Mission Ministries and the Foothills Christian Church.

"Emily Hamlin is a wonderful kid and a very accomplished athlete," said Greg Harm, head coach at Eagle High. "I believe she was the best Idaho girls cross country runner in 2014."

Hamlin has verbally committed to an athletic scholarship at the University of Washington beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Hamlin joins Gatorade Idaho Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Sam McKinnon (2013-14, Mountain View High School), Sierra Manzer (2012-13, Melba High School), Emily Nist (2011-12, Bishop Kelly High School), Kinsey Gomez (2010-11 & 2009-10, Coeur d'Alene High School), Liz Brandon (2008-09, Eagle), and Nicole Nielsen (2007-08, Borah) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
