GREELY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MAINE GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 8, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Katherine Leggat-Barr of Greely High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Maine Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Leggat-Barr is the second Gatorade Maine Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Greely High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Leggat-Barr as Maine's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Leggat-Barr joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-00, 2000-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.) and Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.).

The 5-foot-7 sophomore won the Class B individual state championship with a time of 19:17.12 this past season, leading the Rangers to the state title as a team. Also the Runner of the Year as named by the Maine Sunday Telegram, Leggat-Barr captured 32nd place at the New England Cross Country Championships in 19:25. In addition to finishing unbeaten against Maine prep cross country competitors in 2014, she clocked an 18:51 at the Western Maine Conference meet, which ranked as the state's fastest 5K time of the season.

Leggat-Barr has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. In addition to serving as a member of her school's debate team and qualifying for the statewide science fair project competition, she has manufactured cider for the Rosemont Market and Bakery during the past three autumn harvests.

"She is an aggressive, talented racer," said Danny Paul, head coach of rival Falmouth High. "In all her races I have seen, she pushes herself and anyone who can run with her. My observations of her interactions with teammates and coaches have been refreshing; she cares about her team. Our girls have shared nothing but positive comments regarding her as an opponent and fellow athlete. She did a wonderful job filling the shoes of Greely's top runner who graduated (2013–14 Gatorade State Cross Country Runner of the Year) Kirstin Sandreuter."

Leggat-Barr will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Leggat-Barr joins Gatorade Maine Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Kirstin Sandreuter (2013-14, Greely High School), Bethanie Brown (2012-13, Waterville High School), Abbey Leonardi (2011-12, 2010-11, 2009-10 & 2008-09, Kennebunk High School), and Anna Makaretz (2007-08, Yarmouth) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
