## ALEXANDRIA AREA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MINNESOTA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 8, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Megan Hasz of Alexandria Area High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Minnesota Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. The 5-foot-4 junior raced to a fifth-place finish at the Nike Cross Nationals Final this past season with a time of 17:40. She also earned third at the NXN Heartland Regional championships, crossing the line in 17:17.9. A four-time First Team All-State selection, Hasz captured an individual title at the Class AA state meet, breaking the tape in 13:40.9.

Hasz has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. An accomplished cellist, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Feed My Starving Children.

"Megan Hasz is an amazing young lady who deserves all the accolades that come her way," said Alexandria Area High head coach Travis Hochhalter. "She works hard and is so kind. She knows what it takes and she does it with a smile. She loves to work toward something and is dedicated to the sport of cross country."

Hasz will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
