LEXINGTON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OHIO GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 8, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Dominique Clairmonte of Lexington High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Ohio Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Clairmonte is the first Gatorade Ohio Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Lexington High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Clairmonte as Ohio's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Clairmonte joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-00, 2000-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.) and Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.).

The 5-foot-2 junior raced to the Division II individual state championship this past season with a time of 18:17.1, leading the Minutemen to a second-place finish as a team. A 2014 First Team All-State selection, Clairmonte earned fifth place at the Nike Cross Nationals Midwest Regional championships, crossing the line in 17:39.7. She went on to compete at the NXN Final where she finished 35th with a time of 18:26.

Clairmonte has maintained a 3.74 GPA in the classroom. A talented artist and a member of the National Honor Society, she has volunteered locally on behalf of an animal rescue shelter.

"I had the great pleasure of witnessing Dominique Clairmonte's ability three times this past fall and I loved her strength, aggressiveness and speed throughout any given race," said Dan Lanciancese, head coach at St. Vincent-St. Mary High. "She dominated the races from start to finish. I informed my girls' team that she is new standard that women need to follow if they want to be a truly elite cross country runner"

Clairmonte will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Clairmonte joins Gatorade Ohio Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Annie Heffernan (2013-14, St. Ursula Academy), Mary Kate Vaughn (2012-13, Oakwood High School), Claudia Saunders (2011-12, Princeton High School), Michelle Thomas (2010-11, Glen Este High School), Madeline Chambers (2009-10, Magnificat), Stephanie Morgan (2008-09, Barnesville), and Claire Durkin (2007-08, Worthington Kilbourne) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
