GRANT HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OREGON GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 8, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Ella Donaghu of Grant High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Oregon Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Donaghu is the first Gatorade Oregon Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Grant High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Donaghu as Oregon's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Donaghu joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-00, 2000-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.) and Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.).

The 5-foot-4 junior raced to her second consecutive Class 6A individual state championship this past season with a time of 17:51. The state's returning Gatorade Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year, Donaghu broke the tape at the Nike Cross Nationals Northwest Regional championships in 18:55.8 and captured 10th at the NXN Final to earn All-American honors. She also won the Northwest Classic, the George Fox Invitational and the Nike BorderClash in 2014, while taking second at the Stanford Invitational.

Donaghu has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A mentor for younger runners, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a soup kitchen and a homeless shelter in addition to donating her time to the Friends First Club, which helps assimilate special needs students at her school.

"Ella is the epitome of the gritty, tenacious runner who respects everyone, but fears no one," said Grant coach Doug Winn. "She manages to take care of all the little things involved in great success, in everything she does."

Donaghu will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Donaghu joins Gatorade Oregon Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Sara Tsai (2012-13 & 2011-12, South Eugene High School), Annamarie Maag (2010-11 & 2009-10, Jesuit High School), and Taylor Wallace (2008-09 & 2007-08, Henley), as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
