## SOUTH SIDE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW YORK GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-5 senior forward scored 19 goals and passed for nine assists this past season, leading the Cyclones (15-4-1) to the Class A state final. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Cavallo was named both the Class A Player of the Year and the Long Island Player of the Year.

Cavallo has maintained an A average in the classroom. A peer tutor at her school, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer programs.

"Cavallo is a great player," said Janine Bizelia, head coach at Mepham High. "She's fast and tenacious with good vision and tremendous touch on the ball. She's the type of player who always makes something happen."

Cavallo will attend Yale University this fall, where she will play soccer.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
