## BELLE FOURCHE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE SOUTH DAKOTA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-3 junior forward led the Broncs to an 8-3-1 record and the Class A state championship this past season. Ryan scored 24 goals and passed for five assists, including netting the game-winning goal in Belle Fourche's 2-1 victory over St. Thomas More High in the Class A state title game. A three-time First Team All-State selection, she was the 605Soccer.com Class A Player of the Year.

Ryan has maintained a 4.0 weighted GPA in the classroom. The president of her class as a freshman, sophomore and junior, she has volunteered locally as part of an anti-bullying campaign and community beautification projects. She has also donated her time at the Butte County 4-H rodeo and as a youth basketball coach.

"Jessica has a knowledge for the game unlike many others I have seen," said Adam Fitzpatrick, head coach of Sturgis Brown High. "There is an ability she has to let the game come to her and really dominate it if need be. If she needs to be a scorer, she will score. If she needs to facilitate, then she would assist."

Ryan will begin her senior year of high school this fall.
