SOUTH KENT SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE CONNECTICUT BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 12, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Mickey Watson of South Kent School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Connecticut Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-10, 185-pound senior defender scored three goals, passed for four assists and anchored a defense that recorded 11 shutouts this past season, leading the Cardinals (17-5) to the New England Prep School Athletic Council Class B Tournament championship game. Watson is a two-time Connecticut Soccer Coaches Association First Team All-State selection and a two-time Western New England Prep School Soccer Association All-Star.

Watson has maintained a B-plus average in the classroom. The Head Prefect at South Kent, he has volunteered locally at a food bank and as a youth soccer coach.

"Mickey Watson is the heart and soul of South Kent," said Jon Moodey, head coach of the Berkshire (Mass.) School. "He is the engine that makes his team go. Though his soccer skills are impressive, his positive attitude and tireless work ethic make him so valuable." Watson has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Loyola University Maryland beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
