## BORAH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE IDAHO BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 12, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Josh Szuch of Borah High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Idaho Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 6-foot-2, 200-pound senior forward scored 23 goals and passed for seven assists this past season, leading the Lions (13-5-3) to the Class 5A state quarterfinals. Also the Southern Idaho Conference Class 5A Player of the Year, Szuch was a four-year member of the Borah varsity. He concluded his prep soccer career with 66 goals and 39 assists.

Szuch has maintained a 3.57 GPA in the classroom. An Eagle Scout with the Boy Scouts of America, he has volunteered locally as an elementary school aide and has participated in multiple community-service initiatives in association with his church youth group.

"Josh Szuch is a strong striker who is usually bigger than the defenders who are marking him," said Chris Butzier, head coach of Eagle High. "He was definitely the driving force behind Borah's season."

Szuch has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Brigham Young University-Hawaii beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
