LEE'S SUMMIT HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSOURI BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 12, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced **Dalton Souder of Lee's Summit High School** as its **2014-15 Gatorade Missouri Boys Soccer Player of the Year**. The 6-foot-2 senior defender and midfielder led the Tigers to a 21-3 record and the Class 4 state title this past season. Souder scored 15 goals and passed for eight assists, anchoring a defense that recorded 11 shutouts. Selected as the Class 4 Defensive Player of the Year by the Missouri Soccer Coaches Association, he was a two-time First Team All-State honoree and participated in the High School All-American Game in North Carolina in December.

Souder has maintained a 3.36 weighted GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach.

"Dalton Souder really made his team go," said Chris Lawson, head coach of Rockhurst High. "His approach to leading, contributing and buying into whatever role was asked made others around him better."

Souder has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Furman University in South Carolina beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
