PINKERTON ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW HAMPSHIRE BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 12, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Kyle Hicks of Pinkerton Academy as its 2014-15 Gatorade New Hampshire Boys Soccer Player of the Year. Hicks is the third Gatorade New Hampshire Boys Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Pinkerton Academy.

The 5-foot-9, 155-pound senior midfielder scored 12 goals and passed for six assists this past season, leading the Astros (14-5-1) to the Division 1 state championship. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Hicks scored in every postseason game. He was a First Team All-State honoree and was named the Eagle-Tribune Player of the Year.

Hicks has maintained an A average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of a food pantry, the Special Olympics and youth soccer programs.

"Hicks is a two-way player and he does whatever needs to be done," said Rob Grabill, head coach at Hanover High.

"He's very good offensively, with a great first touch, but he never tries to do too much. He always lets the game come to him."

Hicks will attend Southern New Hampshire University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
