## CIBOLA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW MEXICO BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11, 145-pound senior forward scored 17 goals and passed for 15 assists this past season, leading the Cougars (15-2-2) to the Class 6A state quarterfinals. The Class 6A State Player of the Year, Rivas is a member of the U.S. Youth Soccer Region IV Olympic Development Program team and travelled to Spain in 2013 to participate in a Real Madrid Select Training Program.

Rivas has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and referee.

"I have been coaching high school soccer for 24 years, and Sergio Rivas makes my list of top 10 most dominating players I have coached against," said John Shepard, head coach of Rio Rancho High. "We had to game plan specifically for him, and he still changed the game."

Rivas has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Seattle University beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
