## CENTURY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NORTH DAKOTA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 12, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Jacob Richter of Century High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade North Dakota Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 6-foot, 145-pound senior forward scored 16 goals and passed for 18 assists this past season, leading the Patriots (16-3-2) to a fifth-place finish at the state tournament. A First Team All-State honoree, Richter was also selected to the All-State Tournament team and the All-Western Dakota Association First Team.

Richter has maintained a 3.18 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and Carrie's Kids, which assists at-risk children.

"Richter is a dangerous, dangerous player," said Tyler Gerhardt, head coach at Mandan High. "He's got great speed with the ball and he's very effective getting his team into attacking positions. He's very unselfish too and knows how to create scoring opportunities for his teammates."

Richter has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Mary this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
