## SOUTH BURLINGTON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE VERMONT BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 12, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Aiman Ginawi of South Burlington High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Vermont Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-11, 160-pound senior midfielder scored 15 goals and passed for 12 assists this past season, leading the Rebels (16-1) to the Division I state championship. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Ginawi was also named the Burlington Free Press Player of the Year.

Ginawi has maintained a 4.05 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth instructor for the Islamic Society of Vermont.

"As a midfielder, he's dangerous at all times," said Scott Mosher, head coach at Essex High. "He's electrifying when the ball is at his feet. He's like a chess player who is always a move or two ahead of everyone else."

Ginawi remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
