WEST VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-3 junior forward has led the Wolfpack to a perfect 24-0 record and a berth in the Class 4A state tournament, scheduled for March 19. The state's returning Gatorade Girls Basketball Player of the Year, Hebard is averaging 25.6 points, 13.1 rebounds, 3.5 steals, 2.8 assists and 2.2 blocks per game. A First Team All-State selection and MVP of the Dimond Lady Lynx Shootout, she was also named to USA TODAY's All-USA Alaska First Team.

Hebard has maintained a 3.5 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally assisting the elderly and coaching youth basketball.

"Hebard plays with a lot of poise and character and she is a tremendous athlete," said Roland Hepa, head coach of Barrow High. "She's really a well-rounded player. We would double-team her every time she touched the ball in the paint, because of her ability and size, but she can handle the ball and shoot from the perimeter too."

Hebard will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
