DESERT VISTA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ARIZONA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Anigwe averaged 21.1 points, 11.3 rebounds, 2.7 blocks and 1.9 steals per game. A member of the USA Basketball Women's U17 National Team, she was chosen to play in the McDonald's All-American Game and was selected to USA TODAY's All-USA Arizona First Team.

Anigwe has maintained a 3.56 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of Feed My Starving Children.

"Anigwe is a game-changer," said Jermaine Whitaker, head coach at Marcos de Niza High. "She's tough in the key and she can take her game outside and hit the 15- to 18-foot jump shot. On defense, she makes it difficult to drive to the basket and she's great at getting rebounds."

Anigwe has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of California-Berkeley this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
