BRAINTREE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MASSACHUSETTS GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The state's returning Gatorade State Player of the Year, the 5-foot-10 senior point guard has led the Wamps to a 24-0 record and a berth in the Division 1 state final, scheduled for March 14. At the time of her selection, Russell was averaging 13.2 points, 9.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 3.0 steals per game. The two-time Bay State Conference Player of the Year, she is a four-time First Team All-Conference selection and has scored 1,069 points in her prep basketball career.

Russell has maintained a B-plus average in the classroom. She has volunteered locally with Relay for Life, the Best Buddies International program and as a youth basketball coach.

"Ashley Russell is the type of player that makes her teammates better," said Denise Beliveau, head coach of Framingham High. "Her versatility on offense makes her a big threat, but she also does the little things like make the hustle plays and work on the boards."

Russell has verbally committed to attend the University of Pennsylvania, where she will play basketball beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
