## INCARNATE WORD ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSOURI GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 12, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Napheesa Collier of Incarnate Word Academy as its 2014-15 Gatorade Missouri Girls Basketball Player of the Year. Collier is the fourth Gatorade Missouri Girls Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Incarnate Word Academy.

The 2012-13 Gatorade State Player of the Year, the 6-foot-1 senior forward had led the Red Knights to a 25-2 record and a berth in the Class 4 state tournament. At the time of her selection, Collier was averaging 26.2 points, 12.4 rebounds, 4.1 blocks, 4.1 steals and 2.6 assists per game. A McDonald's All-American Game selection and one of five finalists for the Naismith Girls High School Player of the Year Award, she entered the state tournament with 2,691 points and 1,276 rebounds in her prep basketball career.

Collier has maintained a B average in the classroom. She has volunteered locally with Habitat for Humanity, the Salvation Army and at Marygrove, a youth treatment facility.

"Napheesa Collier is the complete package—size, strength, quickness and smarts," said Scott Small, head coach at the Mary Institute and St. Louis Country Day School. "She has been working on her range and is now one of the best 3-point shooters in the area, too. She is impossible to guard in many ways and I would not want to take the ball at her."

Collier has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Connecticut this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
