BISHOP RYAN CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NORTH DAKOTA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-2 senior guard and forward has led the Lions to a 23-1 record and their third straight Class B state title this past season. Stewart averaged 19.6 points and 11.6 rebounds while shooting 60.9 percent from inside the arc. A three-time First Team All-State selection, she also posted regular-season averages of 6.1 steals, 4.8 blocks and 4.7 assists per game.

Stewart has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has served as the president of the National Honor Society and has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and Students Against Destructive Decisions (S.A.D.D.).

"Hannah Stewart has matured into an amazing player," said Joe Bender, head coach at Bottineau High. "She has everything you would like to see in an all-around player. She is one of the few players in my 25 years of coaching that I can honestly say has no weaknesses. She has everything needed to play collegiately at the Division I level."

Stewart has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Iowa this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
