**BARROW HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED
GATORADE® ALASKA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (March 20, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Kamaka Hepa of Barrow High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Alaska Boys Basketball Player of the Year. Hepa is the first Gatorade Alaska Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Barrow High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the court, distinguishes Hepa as Alaska's best high school boys basketball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Basketball Player of the Year award to be announced in March, Hepa joins an elite alumni association of past state boys basketball award winners, including Dwight Howard (2003-04, SW Atlanta Christian Academy, Ga.), Chauncey Billups (1993-94 & 1994-95, George Washington HS, Colo.), Jason Kidd (1991-92, St. Joseph Notre Dame HS, Calif.), Paul Pierce (1994-95, Inglewood HS, Calif.) and Chris Bosh (2001-02, Lincoln HS, Texas).

The 6-foot-7, 205-pound freshman forward had led the Whalers to a 23-3 record and a berth in the Class 3A state quarterfinals at the time of his selection. Hepa was averaging 17.8 points, 10.4 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per contest through 26 games. A First Team All-State selection, he has been named tournament MVP at the East Anchorage Thunderbird Classic, the Barrow Whaler Invitational and the Lathrop Joe T. Classic.

Hepa has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church youth group, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball programs.

"Hepa is the real deal," said Milo Griffin, head coach at Lathrop High. "He passes well, can score from outside or inside and he never forces anything or takes a bad shot. He can play any position on the floor."

Hepa will begin his sophomore year of high school this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with [USA TODAY High School Sports](#), which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
