NORFOLK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEBRASKA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 20, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Tyler Hagedorn of Norfolk High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Nebraska Boys Basketball Player of the Year. Hagedorn is the first Gatorade Nebraska Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Norfolk High School.

The 6-foot-9, 215-pound senior wing averaged 17.3 points, 6.7 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game this past season, leading the Panthers (25-1) to the Class A state quarterfinals. A returning Lincoln Journal Star Third Team Super-State and Omaha World-Herald Third Team All-Nebraska selection, he shot 50.3 percent from the field, 42.2 percent from 3-point range and 77.3 percent from the free-throw line.

Hagedorn has maintained an A average in the classroom and served on his school's student council. A member of the National Honor Society, Future Business Leaders of America, Key Club International and DECA, he has donated his time as a youth basketball instructor and has volunteered on behalf of both his church and Mercy Meals of America.

"He's a great player from a great program, and most importantly a great kid," said Scott Steinbrook, head coach of rival Kearney High. "He's grown into a leader for Norfolk, he's a fierce competitor, and is very well respected by the players on my team. Tyler has represented himself, his family, his school and his entire community remarkably well over the course of this season, as well as his entire career."

Hagedorn has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of South Dakota this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
