Rated the nation's No. 19 recruit in the Class of 2015 by ESPN, he has been selected to play in the Jordan Brand Classic and the McDonald's All-American games.

Richardson has maintained a 3.48 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, he serves as a math tutor at his school and has volunteered locally on behalf of an assisted living facility.

"Richardson's got great size and great versatility," said Jonathan Stone, head coach at The Hun School. "He's very skilled, very smooth, with the ability to shoot from deep."

Richardson has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Syracuse University this fall.
