## THE HAVERFORD SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® PENNSYLVANIA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-3, 170-pound senior guard led the Fords to a 17-11 record and the semifinals of the Pennsylvania Independent Schools tournament this past season. Alston averaged 19.6 points, 5.1 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game. A three-time First Team All-Inter-Academic League selection, he was conference co-MVP as a sophomore and a Second Team All-State honoree as a junior. Alston is rated the nation's No. 93 recruit in the Class of 2015 by ESPN.

Alston has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball programs.

"Alston really slices up defenses," said Jamie Chadwin, head coach at Springside Chestnut Hill Academy. "He's fantastic at getting into the paint and finishing, he's got a strong mid-range pull-up game ... he can dominate a team in a number of different ways. He's also a consummate team player, with an ability to make other guys better."

Alston has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Temple University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
