Dozier has maintained a 3.09 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally with a children's museum, as a mentor for children with special needs and on behalf of the American Red Cross.

"P.J. Dozier is an unbelievable player who makes his teammates better," said Layne Fowler, head coach at Byrnes High.
"He seems to have a wonderful attitude and I think he is one of the best players our state has seen in a long time."

Dozier has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of South Carolina this fall.
