WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® SOUTH DAKOTA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 20, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Deng Geu of Washington High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade South Dakota Boys Basketball Player of the Year. Geu is the first Gatorade South Dakota Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Washington High School.

The 6-foot-9, 180-pound senior forward has led the Warriors to a 20-2 record and a berth in the quarterfinals of the Class AA state quarterfinals against Huron, scheduled for March 19. Geu is averaging 17.5 points, 7.8 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game entering the state tournament. He was selected to the All-City Team and the All-State Tournament Team as a junior.

Geu has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of an elementary school literacy-outreach initiative.

"Deng Geu is unbelievably athletic for a 6-foot-9 kid," said Brent Deckert, head coach at Brandon Valley High. "He can handle the ball, shoot from the outside and he just destroys the inside. He's always a factor in the paint and makes it very tough to score anything in there."

Geu has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at North Dakota State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
