OAK HILL ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® VIRGINIA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Bacon averaged 24.4 points, 4.4 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 2.2 steals through 45 games. He was selected to participate in the McDonald's All-American Game and the Jordan Brand Classic.

Bacon has maintained a B-plus average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally with the Special Olympics and the Boys and Girls Clubs of America.

"Dwayne Bacon is a big, explosive wing who can make tough shots," said Brandon Clifford, head coach of High Point Christian High. "He is the one guy they have that can get a basket without much help. It's hard to defend a guy with that size and athleticism at the high school level."

Bacon has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Florida State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
