## TERRY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSISSIPPI BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 11, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Wanner Paiz of Terry High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Mississippi Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-7, 160-pound senior midfielder scored 31 goals and passed for 18 assists this past season, leading the Bulldogs (16-1-3) to the second round of the Class 6A state tournament. A two-time Clarion Ledger First Team All-State selection, Paiz was named a South All-Star by the Mississippi Association of Coaches. He concluded his prep soccer career with 47 goals and 33 assists.

Paiz has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach.

"Wanner was an elite player on an unexceptional team and had to make things happen himself," said Tyler Wade, head coach of Clinton High. "Not only does he score a lot of goals for his high school team, but he also plays center back for his club team and excels no matter where he is on the field."

Paiz has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Hinds Community College beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
