## HERITAGE HALL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 11, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Garrett McLaughlin of Heritage Hall as its 2014-15 Gatorade Oklahoma Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 6-foot, 170-pound junior forward had led the Chargers to a 13-1 record and the quarterfinals of the Class 5A state tournament at the time of his selection. McLaughlin scored 27 goals and passed for 13 assists through 14 games. A First Team All-City and All-District selection, he helped Heritage Hall to state championships in 2013 and 2014.

McLaughlin has maintained a 3.33 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer programs and tornado clean-up efforts, and raised money to defray the costs of a young child's open-heart surgery.

"I haven't seen a kid that age who understands the game as well as McLaughlin does," said Matt Grassmyer, head coach at Oklahoma Christian School. "He's fast, plays well with both feet, reads the game well and makes all the right decisions."

McLaughlin will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
