PADUA ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DELAWARE GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-4 senior midfielder and forward has led the Pandas to a 14-0-1 record entering the Division 1 state tournament. Panella scored 15 goals and passed for 10 assists in the regular season. A First Team All-State selection, she has helped Padua Academy to three straight state titles and a current No. 16 ranking nationally according to the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

Panella has maintained a 3.52 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and multiple youth sports programs.

"Panella plays incredibly hard on both sides of the ball," said Paul Booton, head coach at Dover High. "She sees the field so well, and everything goes through her. She's the engine of that team."

Panella has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Delaware this fall.
