## ST. TERESA'S ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSOURI GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 19, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Dorian Bailey of St. Teresa's Academy as its 2014-15 Gatorade Missouri Girls Soccer Player of the Year. The returning Gatorade Player of the Year, the 5-foot-6 senior forward and midfielder had led the Stars to a 15-2-1 record and a berth in the Class 4, District 14 tournament semifinals at the time of her selection. Bailey scored 12 goals and passed for four assists through 18 games, missing five to participate in a training camp with the U.S. Soccer Under-19 Women's National Team. The 2014 Missouri Soccer Coaches Association Class 3 Co-Player of the Year, she was a 2014 All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and is rated as the No. 8 recruit in the nation for the Class of 2015 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Bailey has maintained an A average in the classroom. A member of the Interact Club through Rotary International, she has volunteered locally at a preschool for special-needs children and as a youth soccer coach.

"Dorian is an extremely talented soccer player," said Todd Krey, head coach of Lee's Summit West High. "She has the ability to take over a game when necessary, but at the same time, play simple."

Bailey has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of North Carolina beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <a href="USA TODAY High School Sports">USA TODAY High School Sports</a>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
