JENKS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A three-time All-District selection, she is ranked as the nation's No. 81 player in the Class of 2015 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Dao has maintained a 4.10 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally assisting the homeless and coaching youth sports teams.

"Dao is such a skilled player and she really makes that team go," said Nicki West, head coach at Booker T. Washington High. "She's extremely smart, plays within her role and is so effective in everything she does."

Dao has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Oklahoma this fall.
