## KETCHIKAN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 28, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Nathan Bonck of Ketchikan High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Alaska Baseball Player of the Year. The 6-foot-5, 195-pound junior left-handed pitcher has led the King Salmon to a 12-3 record with the regional tournament scheduled to begin May 28. At the time of his selection, he had posted a 3-0 record with a 1.11 ERA and 22 strikeouts in 19 innings. A 2014 First Team All-Southeast Conference honoree, he batted .489 with four home runs, 22 RBI and a .957 slugging percentage through 15 games, also playing outfield and first base.

Bonck has maintained a 3.0 GPA in the classroom. A standout on the varsity basketball team, he has volunteered locally on behalf of the Young Life faith-based ministry and as a youth baseball coach and umpire.

"I've watched Nathan Bonck for the last three years and he is by far the best player in southeast Alaska," said Ed Conway, head coach at Sitka High. "He's a big hard throwing lefty with a ton of power. He plays the game the right way."

Bonck has verbally committed to play baseball on scholarship at Seattle University beginning in the fall of 2016.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
