ST. JOHN'S COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 28, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced A.J. Lee of St. John's College High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade District of Columbia Baseball Player of the Year. Lee is the eleventh Gatorade District of Columbia Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from St. John's College High School.

The 6-foot-1, 175-pound senior shortstop and right-handed pitcher led the Cadets (26-5) to their second straight Washington Catholic Athletic Conference championship this past season. The District's returning Gatorade Baseball Player of the Year, Lee posted a 7-0 record on the mound with a 0.43 ERA and 58 strikeouts in 49 innings pitched. He is a two-time Washington Post First Team All-Met honoree and he batted .388 with 34 runs-scored, 22 RBI and a .527 on-base percentage this spring.

Lee has maintained a 3.38 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of an area nursing home and the Miracle League working with athletes with special needs.

"A.J. Lee has excelled not only as a player but also as a person and a leader," said St. John's head coach Mark Gibbs. "He consistently put the team and the program in front of himself on the field as well as in the classroom and the community."

Lee has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Maryland this
