PLYMOUTH NORTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MASSACHUSETTS BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 28, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Joe Walsh of Plymouth North High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Massachusetts Baseball Player of the Year. Walsh is the first Gatorade Massachusetts Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Plymouth North High School.

The 6-foot-1, 215-pound junior left-handed pitcher and first baseman had led the Blue Eagles to a 12-6 record at the time of his selection. Walsh owned a 4-1 record and a 0.58 ERA through 18 games, also producing a .429 batting average and 20 RBI. He had 58 strikeouts in 36 innings pitched, surrendering just 12 hits. A Perfect Game Third Team Underclass All-American, Walsh was an All-League selection and a Patriot Ledger All-Scholastic honoree as a sophomore.

Walsh has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth sports programs and an elementary school reading initiative.

"Walsh is tough, hard-nosed and very skilled," said Paul Funk, head coach at Dennis-Yarmouth High. "He's the epitome of what a high school baseball player should be. I love competing against him."

Walsh will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
