## LITCHFIELD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MINNESOTA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 28, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Eduardo Estrada of Litchfield High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Minnesota Baseball Player of the Year. Estrada is the first Gatorade Minnesota Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Litchfield High School.

The 6-foot, 210-pound senior shortstop had led the Dragons to a 14-6 record at the time of his selection. Through 20 games, Estrada owned a .565 batting average with seven home runs, 36 RBI and 35 runs-scored. He stole 11 bases and posted a .685 on-base percentage, with a slugging percentage of 1.097. An All-Conference, All-Section and All-Area selection in 2014, Estrada was also a Perfect Game Honorable Mention Preseason All-American.

Estrada has maintained a 3.40 GPA in the classroom. A peer mentor in his school, he has volunteered on behalf of youth baseball, hockey and football programs.

"Estrada exemplifies everything a ball player should be," said Mike Thompson, head coach at New London-Spicer High.
"He has a plan each and every time he steps to the plate. He doesn't give in, and he's relentless."

Estrada has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at the University of Minnesota this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
