## BISHOP HENDRICKEN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® RHODE ISLAND BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 28, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Gian Martellini of Bishop Hendricken High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Rhode Island Baseball Player of the Year. Martellini is the tenth Gatorade Rhode Island Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Bishop Hendricken High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Martellini as Rhode Island's best high school baseball player. The state's returning Gatorade Baseball Player of the Year had led the Hawks to a 15-0 record at the time of his selection. A 6-foot-1, 205-pound senior catcher, Martellini batted .500 with one home run and 21 RBI through 15 games. The Perfect Game USA Preseason Honorable Mention All-American also scored 12 runs and worked 14 walks, recording a .607 on-base percentage. A returning First Team All-State honoree, he started for Bishop Hendricken's 2013 Division I state championship team as a sophomore.

Martellini has maintained a 3.06 GPA in the classroom. In addition to donating his time as a youth baseball instructor, he has volunteered on behalf of Habitat for Humanity and his school's peer-mentoring program for students with educational and developmental disabilities.

"Gian is an outstanding catching prospect," said Bishop Hendricken head coach Ed Holloway. "He is big and strong and has very good baseball skills. He has a strong, accurate arm. And he receives and blocks well. He has tremendous upside, since this is only his third year catching. He hits for power, average and is a clutch RBI hitter. He has matured so much as a player and person over the last year."

Martellini has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Boston College this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
