BELTON-HONEA PATH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® SOUTH CAROLINA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 28, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Jake Crawford of Belton-Honea Path High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade South Carolina Baseball Player of the Year. At the time of his selection, the 6-foot-1, 190-pound senior right-handed pitcher and infielder had led the Bears to a 26-4 record and the Class AAA championship series. Crawford owned a 9-0 record and a 0.57 ERA with 81 strikeouts in 61.1 innings through 30 games. A two-time First Team All-State honoree, he batted .337 with a pair of home runs, 24 RBI and 23 runs-scored entering the state finals.

Crawford has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom and is ranked second in a graduating class of 244 students. The vice president of the National Honor Society, he is a member of the Beta Club and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has volunteered locally on behalf of Meals on Wheels as well as the U.S. Marine Corps Toys for Tots Foundation.

"Jake Crawford is an outstanding player, a great competitor and displays tremendous sportsmanship," said Matthew Frazier, head coach at Palmetto High. "I understand he is an outstanding student and hard worker, as well. He is a wonderful representative for South Carolina."

Crawford has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Furman University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
